CITY OF CIRCLEVILLE RECEIVES TAP FUNDING:

The City of Circleville recently applied for the Transportation Alternatives Program Funding for a shared-use path along E Ohio Street. The project received 80% of its total funding and the funds will be available in State Fiscal Year 2027. The proposed path will create safer transportation options for walkers, runners, and bicyclists as well as access to Barthelmas Park from Downtown Circleville and surrounding residential areas.

SMART GROWTH INITIATIVE SECOND AWARD:

The Smart Growth Committee recently approved their second application for funding. The Village of Ashville will be receiving over \$14,000 to help update their Zoning Code. ALL OHIO FUTURE FUND APPLICATION

We recently submitted for All-Ohio Future Funds in conjunction with VanTrust Real Estate. To attract advanced manufacturing and other high-impact developments, we have identified a critical need for infrastructure improvements at Park762. We are seeking the All-Ohio Future Funds assistance for the 54-inch regional sanitary sewer line, which totals \$16 million. This line will service 600+ acres of fully entitled, available industrial development ground and surrounding acreage, in addition to the 286-acre Park 762 site.

OHIO CAPITAL BUDGET FUNDING ANNOUNCED

\$2.95 million dollars is coming to Pickaway County from the State Capital Budget. The Ohio House of Representatives recently passed Substitute House Bill 2, which includes funding for local projects from the state's construction budget.

Key allocations for Pickaway County include:

- \$1.5 million for US 23 widening in South Bloomfield
- \$750,000 to enhance Barthelmas Park in Circleville
- \$500,000 to support new science programs at Ohio Christian University
- \$200,000 for replacing windows at Historic Memorial Hall in Circleville

We are very excited to see these projects move forward in our community and are very thankful for Rep. Brian Stewart's support in helping to secure funding for projects in the County.
